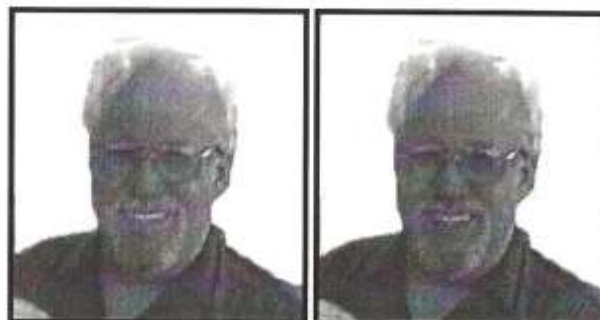

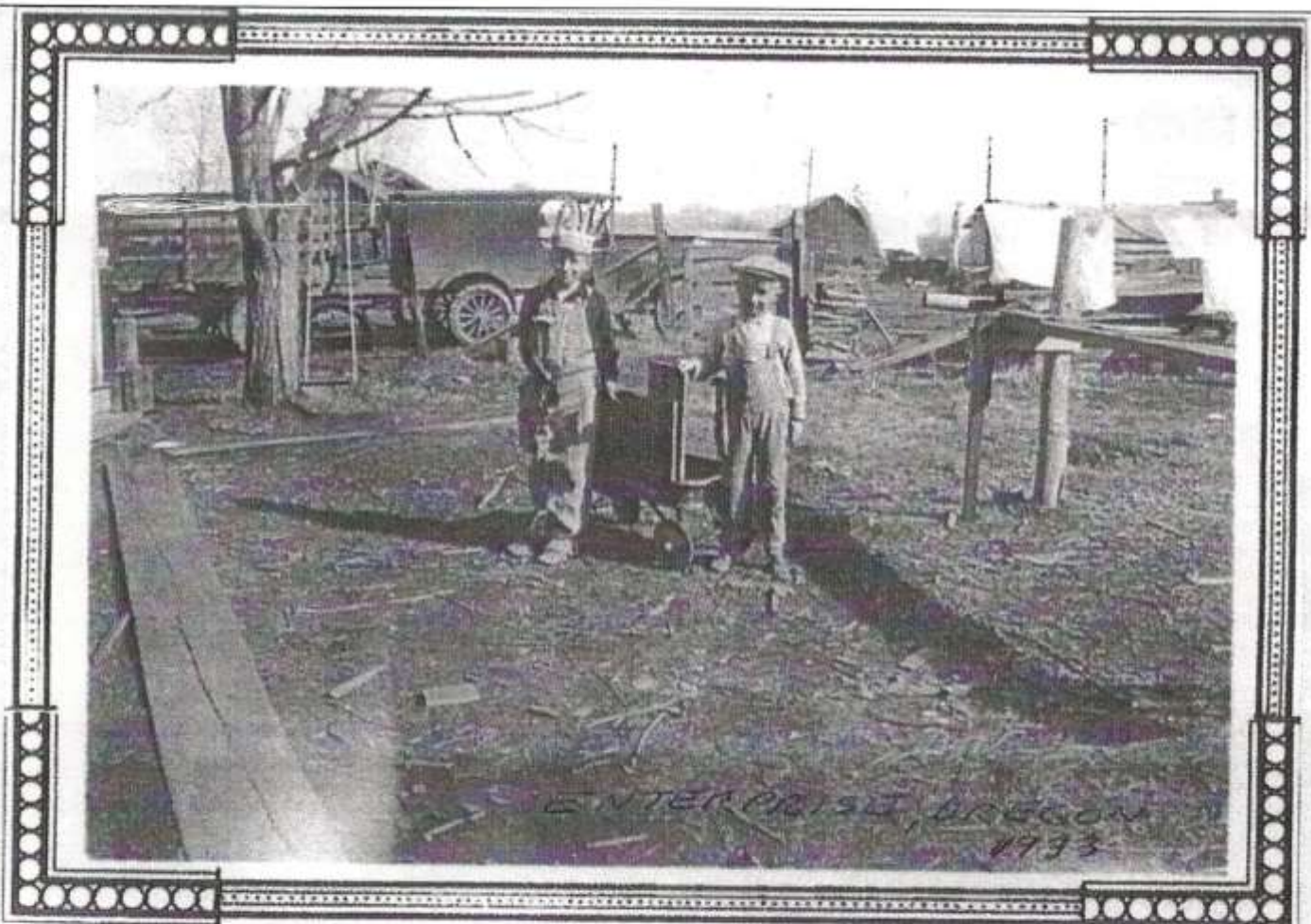
### The toys that started it all

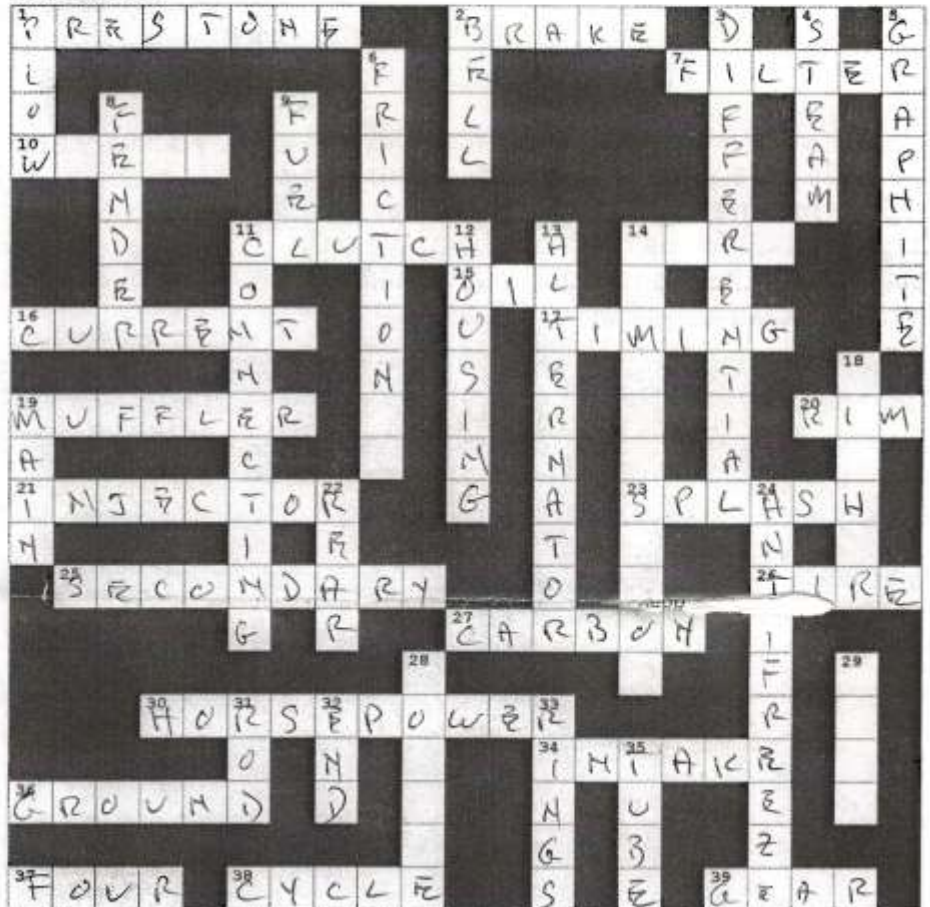
